The emergency nursing specialization exam at the diploma level consists of 100 questions, while the advanced specialized nurse exam at the master level consists of 150 questions. The passing grade for the specialization exam for both majors is 65%. The distribution of questions primarily depends on the client's health needs listed in Table 1. The distribution of exam questions also takes into account the main topics in the emergency specialization and according to human body systems presented in table number 2. At the end of this guidance document, there is a suggested list of approved references for preparing for the exam. Congratulations again and our best wishes for success.
